Kōwae Ako - Module Overview

This place-based learning experience is delivered at the iconic Opihi Taniwha Māori rock art site, an area of the highest cultural significance to manawhenua, Te Rūnanga o Arowhenua, and to Ngāi Tahu Whānui as a whole.

This module encourages proactive investigation and handson learning in the area of visual arts for students from Years 1 to 8. Our local manawhenua guides will support students to explore the wider cultural context in which the rock art was created, its possible meaning and function, and its value both to Ngāi Tahu past and present, and as part of our national visual arts heritage.

Students will also explore the traditional materials and techniques used by the ancestors, and will create their own artworks in response to the rich cultural landscape at Opihi. Senior students will have an opportunity to explore the works of contemporary Ngāi Tahu artists inspired by the rock art. Contextual Te Reo Māori vocabulary and concepts will be included throughout this module.

Levels 1 - 2
