Who we are	The Ngāi Tahu Māori Rock Art Trust was established in 2002 to support mana whenua Rūnanga (local tribal councils) and their communities in the care, management, and interpretation of their Māori rock art heritage.
	The main objectives of the Trust are to ensure the preservation and protection, education, and cultural revitalisation of Māori rock art for the benefit of Ngāi Tahu whānui and all New Zealanders, and to take a leading role in supporting the conservation and management of rock art throughout the Ngāi Tahu rohe (region).
Role Purpose	The focus of this position is to grow and develop the role of Te Ana Māori Rock Art Centre as a deliverer of high-quality educational programmes focused on Māori rock art and mana whenua history and culture, amongst the local South Canterbury education sector and that of adjoining regions.
Specific Duties	 Establish and maintain strong networks within the education sector in South Canterbury and adjoining regions (Canterbury and North Otago) Develop and implement a schedule of promotional activities to the education sector throughout the year Contribute to the development of curriculum-based programmes to all education sectors (early childhood, primary and secondary schools, alternative education, tertiary providers) Contribute to the development of resources to support the education programme Work with teachers to deliver tailored educational experiences, including managing bookings, linking to curriculum strands, providing pre and post visit resources, and collecting and collating teacher and student evaluations Lead the delivery of curriculum-based, hands-on educational experiences to school groups both at Te Ana Māori Rock Art Centre and at the rock art sites at Ōpihi Meet key performance indicators, including student numbers, evaluation of educational services, and continued improvement of the educational programme Continually build knowledge of mana whenua culture, history and mātauranga, as a basis for the development of compelling and empowering education and visitor experiences
