Who we are	The Ngãi Tahu Māori Rock Art Trust was established in 2002 to support mana whenua Rūnanga (local tribal councils) and their communities in the care, management, and interpretation of their Māori rock art heritage.			
	The main objectives of the Trust are to ensure the preservation and protection, education, and cultural revitalisation of Māori rock art for the benefit of Ngāi Tahu whānui and all New Zealanders, and to take a leading role in supporting the conservation and management of rock art throughout the Ngāi Tahu rohe (region).

Other

Hours of work

The opening hours of Te Ana Māori Rock Art Centre are 10am to 3pm, Tuesday to Saturday. Guided tours to Ōpihi are offered from 3pm to 5.30pm, from November to March, on an 'as booked' basis.

As a tourism business, Te Ana is at its busiest during the peak season months of January and February, working with Free Independent Travelers (FIT) and small guided tour groups. Over the period November to March, Te Ana is contracted to deliver guided tours to the cruise market, with 15-20 ships typically arriving in Timaru over that period. The schedule of cruise ship visits is usually known six months in advance, but on occasion an unexpected ship can arrive, and we may only be given a few days day's warning. Vessels can be scheduled to arrive on any day of the week, including weekends and public holidays.

The successful applicant would be expected to work one Saturday every three weeks at Te Ana Māori Rock Art Centre on a regular rostered basis, and the occasional public holiday as required. During the months of January and February limited leave can be taken, with a maximum of one week approved if there is sufficient staff cover. Outside of this period there is flexibility to take longer leave periods, by mutual agreement. All staff are expected to be available to work on days that cruise ships are scheduled to visit Timaru, including some weekend days and public holidays.

The role may require use of your own vehicle from time to time, a current driver's license is required.
